With regard to the forever recurring rejections through sudden apologies of your Members of the Executives to all invitations sent to them by petitions committee to Gauteng Petitions Public hearings since your election as the Premier of Gauteng in 2014 to date, could the Premier please indicate:

- (i) if the Premier is aware of a consistent absence through a common pattern of apologies by Members of his Executive to all petition public hearings where they are forever invited timeously so;
- (ii) if there has been any instruction from the Premier to Members of the Executive not to attend public hearings of the Petitions Committee where the Committee chair has invited them to respond and participate in finding solutions to the growing number of petitions in the Province;
- (iii) if not to (ii) above, then what causes the consistent same patterned attitude of forever filling apology letters, it can be understood once in a while that they could be held up by other work related matters but not as always since the beginning of term of office to date;
- (iv) whether the Premier is aware that many of officials second by MECs come unprepared and are unable to make immediate decisions to public hearing; and
- (v) is the Premier intending to ensure speedily resolution to all outstanding petitions sent to all the Gauteng Provincial Government departments, please give a detailed plan if so?

In view of information given at the finance portfolio committee on 21 October that the Premier will engage National Treasury regarding hundreds of millions of rands owed by a range of government departments, could the Premier please indicate:

- (i) has the date been set for this meeting;

- (iii) if not, by when will the Premier make such an appointment?

4. ED017.**Ms M S Mashego (EFF) to ask the Member of the Executive Council for Education:**

In Johannesburg region, Zandspruit, in Subregion C, Ward 114 there is no high or secondary school therefore, could the MEC please indicate:

- (i) when will a High School be built for the citizens living in the area;
- (ii) are you aware that the scholar transport that is available to transport grades 8 to 12 pupils from Zandspruit to CosmoCity is inadequate and that there are problems with the service, to the extent that many of the pupils end up walking to school; and
- (iii) if you are not aware of the above; please confirm that you will look into the service urgently, get to the bottom of the issues and provide solutions?

4. PS010.**Ms M S Mashego (EFF) to ask the Member of the Executive Council for Community Safety:**

With regard to rampant crime, inadequate and poor policing services offered by the Honeydew Police Station in general to the Zandspruit, Honeydew, inside the Golden Harvest City Park and the Northgate areas in Johannesburg. The poor performance of this police service has resulted in the sustained presence of things like the unrelenting drug dealing activity that is happening under the constant watch of police who patrol the area often and yet make no difference, pedestrians being mugged, including window smashing of motorists. In light of this preamble, could the MEC please indicate:

- (i) why are the Honeydew police not patrolling on foot to catch muggers, drug dealers, rapists amongst other thugs operating in Zandspruit, Honeydew and Northgate;
- (ii) are you aware that there is an attempted community policing forum formed in Zandspruit but the police refuse to cooperate with them or give them any support or guidance on how to maximise their efforts for the benefit of the community;
- (iii) please explain how long it would take for the SAPS in the Province to make available an efficient satellite police station with officers patrolling the area on foot (in Zandspruit);
- (iv) are you aware of the drug-peddling activities and muggings happening in the Northgate area affecting mainly pedestrians; and
- (v) do you know that the police are always patrolling the area in their vans and can be often seen doing so, yet crime incidents continue unabated – to the extent that the Golden Harvest park has now become an area where women get raped?

Ms C Mabala (EFF) to ask the Member of the Executive Council for Health:

The transfer of 2,378 mentally ill patients from the Life Esidimeni Health Institution in Randfontein has resulted in the death of 36 patients and one of the families are preparing to sue the Health department for negligence.

This is against a background that the department already spends R13.1 billion on legal claim and additional R200 million every-year for medical negligence, could the MEC please indicate:

- (i) since these patients need special care inevitably at a cost, how do you expect inexperienced NGOs, scrambling for small government subsidies to be able to meet their needs adequately;
- (ii) how is expecting poor families or relative to shoulder their care any different from privatisation of public health care;
- (iii) have you seen the families of those that died and took personal responsibility;
- (iv) why the families were contacted only by SMS to inform them of the move of their mentally ill loved us; and
- (v) why was the MEC so hasty in implementing this policy which was envisioned to come into full effect in 2021?

4. ECD,ENV&ARD012. Ms M S Mashego (EFF) to ask the Member of the Executive Council for Economic Development, Environment, Agriculture and Rural Development:

Black trucking operators (haulers) within the logistics industry, face an untransformed industry characterised by white monopoly capital hoarding through the creation of harsh entry barriers, a lot of unnecessary red tape worsened by the so-called BEE participants who are not helping the situation but in fact gatekeeping real Black entrepreneurs ensuring their participation is permanently frustrated.

With the above in mind, could the MEC please indicate:

- (i) what engagements have you had with White monopoly companies such as Value Logistics, Unitrans Tanker Services and Imperial Cargo (the Big Three) plus others such as Heyman Transport, Oosthuizen Transport, Ngololo Transport, Super Group etc. to find out the extent to which they equitably share business with Black operators who are struggling to grow;
- (ii) are you aware of the harsh conditions Black operators face in the industry where the commercial banks refuse to finance them to purchase new trucks because they are unable to secure long-term contracts from large enterprises across various industries;
- (iii) what collaborative efforts do you have with Community Safety and the Department of Roads and Transport to mitigate the lack of protection for South African Black haulers who find

- themselves competing with truckers from the neighbouring countries, often operating illegally and illegal vehicle registration licences, who haul goods illegally and at a highly reduced cost making the industry hostile to local operators;
- (iv) what have you done about those specific monopolised industries such as the petroleum and chemicals, beverages, commercial agricultural sector, paper, pharmaceutical and medical equipment and large retailers amongst others; who have created very stringent requirements (with no added developmental support offered) to all operators; making it almost impossible for Black operators to meet, as part of their procurement criteria for awarding work; and
 - (v) are you aware that today, an overwhelming majority of truck drivers are not South Africans and are unable to secure decent work in the formal haulage industry due to the very low wages that are paid to drivers from neighbouring countries – removing economic protection for Black South Africans?

4. TR012. Ms M S Mashego (EFF) to ask the Member of the Executive Council for Roads & Transport:

The vehicle licencing process of haulers in the Gauteng is fraught with corruption; in this context could the MEC please indicate:

- (i) are you aware of the corrupt activities prevalent at the Benoni, Langlaagte, Alberton and Wadeville licencing stations or departments in the Ekurhuleni and Johannesburg metropolitan municipalities where haulers are passed or issued licences fraudulently by staff at these stations;
- (ii) if you are, what are you doing about the bribery and broader corruption allegations involving these stations specifically;
- (iii) are you aware that there are illegal haulers from our Zimbabwean and Zambian neighbours primarily and to a lesser extent other neighbouring countries to SA, who are illegally hauling goods like copper, fake cigarettes and clothing in and around Gauteng and are operating in cartels;
- (iv) if you are aware of the above question – what investigations have you done involving other state security and law enforcement agencies that should be collaborating with your department to root out this rot; and
- (v) are you aware that there are haulers from the neighbouring countries who manage to haul goods using Gauteng registered trailers (in the context of horse and trailers while the main trucks are not registered as such?

- (v) why he is deliberately and actively involving himself in the destabilisation of the Tshwane municipality?
