





COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT MEETINGS

An analysis of the comments received and Gautrain Management Agency's commitment to transparency, fairness, openness and clarity necessitated the need for interactive and in-person community engagement meetings. The themes from the comments were amongst others related to:

- The fear of imminent expropriation
- The fear of property value depreciation
- Misunderstanding of processes
- Uncertainty of timelines and impact thereof

The Gautrain Management Agency planned Community engagement meetings via the Local ward Councillors and Community leaders in the Sharonlea and Bordeaux areas on 13 and 28 July 2022. The meetings were hybrid to ensue that majority people can attend, via links on Gautrain's social media platforms.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT MEETINGS

Approximately 217 people attended the meeting at Sharonlea and 187 people joined the meeting online via YouTube. The Bordeaux meeting was attended by 144 people and 366 people viewed the meeting on YouTube.

The GMA is committed to ongoing community engagement and will continue with these meetings.

A Local Ward Councillor in-person meeting with all the Local Ward Councillors in the proposed route areas is schedule for the 22 August 2022. Thereafter a hybrid meeting with communities in Craighall, Hurlingham and Northriding will follow.

As part of the Preliminary Design Process interested and affected parties will be invited to register on the Gautrain Management Agency Website for consultation on the process.


The Interested and affected parties will also be consulted as part of the preliminary design process itself and the Environmental Impact Assessment process.
