5	Illegal Occupation of Land: St. Hubert Catholic Church (Alexandra) PP25D/03/23/LO	 The petitioner is Ms. Zodwa Tladi, an adult female who resides at 76-5th Road, Kew, Johannesburg, submitting this petition on behalf of St. Hubert Catholic Church, Alexandra. The petitioner alleges that there is an informal settlement that has been established on the church site without the consent of the congregants or leadership of the church. She further alleges that the illegal inhabitants have connected water and electricity from the church supply which has caused the consumption of the "church" to be very high thus resulting in the church incurring high bills for water, electricity, and rates & taxes. She also alleges that the illegal connection of electricity by the illegal inhabitants of the informal settlement is a safety hazard to the congregants as they still worship on site. Furthermore, there has been an increase of crime in the area because of the newly established informal settlement which has extended to the church building as the church doors, windows and frames were stolen leaving the church damaged. She therefore requests for the urgent intervention of the Legislature as the church wants to expand and open a primary school but is unable to do so under the current conditions. The petitioner alleges that there is a clinic on 18 Hofmeyer street, Alexandra, Ward 116, which was built and completed in 2015 but has not been opened to date. He further alleges that the residents of Ward 116 decided to write and submit a petition to the Legislature as they currently must walk a long distance to access the nearest clinic although they have one in the area that is not operational. He therefore requests that the Legislature intervenes by ensuring that the Department of Health operationalises the clinic.
