By engaging actively with their constituents and leveraging social media platforms, they are fostering transparency and accountability while advocating for policies that benefit their communities. Their presence in the legislature not only energises discussions around governance but also challenges traditional norms and practices within the political arena.

As these young leaders navigate the complexities of legislative processes, they are increasingly collaborating across party lines, through the different Portfolio Committees in which they serve, to champion inclusive policies and effective service delivery. The impact of their contributions extends beyond mere legislation; they are redefining political engagement for younger generations and inspiring a more participatory democracy in Gauteng.



Hon Moipone Mhlongo

African National Congress (ANC)

From her early days as President of the Representative Council of Learners (RCL) at Vezikhono Secondary School, Honourable Mhlongo has dedicated her life to uplifting society. Since then, she has held numerous leadership roles, including SASCO's Deputy Chairperson & Chairperson, district committee member of the Young Communist League of South Africa (YCLSA), and SASCO Secretary General.

In 2019, she was sworn in as a PR Councillor in the City of Ekurhuleni and in 2022 as a Deputy Regional Secretary of the ANC in Ekurhuleni, making her the youngest leader in the ANC at that time. She currently serves as a member of the Gauteng Legislature and chairs the Portfolio Committee for Education.

She is doing a BA Honours in Developmental Studies, and has a BA Politics, Philosophy & Economics from UJ.

Hon Vuyiswa Jentile African National Congress (ANC)

Honourable Jentile's political activism is rooted in student, youth, and civil society movements.

She has fulfilled many leadership roles, including SASCO Gauteng's first female Chairperson, Deputy Convener of the Gauteng ANCYL PTT, and is the incumbent Spokesperson and Regional Executive Committee member of the ANC Women's League, to name but a few.

After the 2024 general elections, she was elected as an MPL in the Gauteng Legislature and serves as the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Petitions.

She holds an Honours Degree in Financial Management and a Certificate in Business Administration from Regent Business School, a BTech Diploma in Cost & Management Accounting from VUT, and a Diploma in Project Management from the North-West University.

Hon Ntsako Mogobe African National Congress (ANC)

Honourable Ntsako Mogobe is a passionate advocate for youth development and a seasoned political leader, currently serving as the Deputy Chief Whip in the Gauteng Legislature. He also plays a significant role as the Chairperson of the ANC Youth League in Gauteng. His leadership journey spans over a decade. He has championed youth empowerment, aiming to create opportunities for future generations through his political and community roles.

He has served as a Secretary of the Young Communist League – Soshanguve Central Branch, Elections Coordinator for Soshanguve Ward 89 ANC Branch, and Convener of the Provincial Congress Preparatory Committee for Gauteng ANCYL, to name but a few roles. He once served as Technical Advisor to the MEC at the Department of Sports, Arts, Culture & Recreation, and the MEC for Social Development.

Hon Khathutshelo Rasilingwane Democratic Alliance (DA)

Honourable Rasilingwane started off as a community activist and was later elected as Ward 92 Branch Youth Chairperson, where she was instrumental in campaigns focused on addressing youth issues. In 2015, she served as the Bronberg Constituency Secretary. In that same year, she was chosen as a candidate for the Ward 2 Councillor position. She was subsequently elected as a PR Councillor for the City of Ekurhuleni, where she served as the Shadow MMC for Health & Social Development.

In 2017, she was elected as the Gauteng DA's Deputy Chairperson in the Recruitment & Campaigns portfolio.

In 2021, she was elected as a Councillor during the local government election. She also served as the Peter Molapo Constituency Chairperson. In 2022, she served as the MMC for Community Safety in Ekurhuleni.

Hon Ruhan Robinson Democratic Alliance (DA)

Honourable Ruhan Robinson joined the DA Student Organisation in 2009, after which he went on to become a Councillor in 2014.

He served as a Councillor for eight years before joining the Gauteng Legislature in 2022. From 2014 to 2016 he served as PR Councillor in the City of Ekurhuleni, and held the position of Ward Councillor in the City of Ekurhuleni from 2016 to 2021, after which he became the Member of the Mayoral Committee (MMC) for Corporate and Shared Services in the City of Ekurhuleni from 2021 to 2022.

He has a B.Com LLB from the University of Pretoria and is currently doing an MBA at Wits Business School.
